Students will receive training on a variety of welding machines. They will learn the proper methods for welding different types of materials – aluminum, mild steel, cast iron, and stainless steel. These skills can be used in different trades such as automotive technology, plumbing, general maintenance, and construction. Student can earn an industry-recognized credential – OSHA 10 – as well as certifications through the American Welding Society (AWS).
